This month, the University of Greenwich will host its second annual Trailblazing Women On and Off Screen International Conference, a solutions-focussed event that aims to continue the conversation and inspire women to work within the traditionally male-dominated arena of film and TV.

This year the event will expand the discussion to an international level, with speakers from across Europe, the USA and Hong Kong. Highlights of the event include an industry panel on solutions for equal access for women in film and TV, including former actor and MP Tracy Brabin, and a panel on the future for women in film and TV, including Baroness Tanni-Grey-Thompson.

Gemma Jackson, the Emmy award-winning production designer of 'Game of Thrones', 'Finding Neverland' and 'Bridget Jones's Diary' will also take part in a special Q&A at the conference. Gemma is the recipient of the conference's Trailblazing Women Recognition Award.

Speaking about the event, Lucy Brown, head of film and television at the university and organiser of the event, said:

"Gender equality has come to the fore in 2018, with movements such as #MeToo and Time's Up placing the issue front and centre in the news agenda.

"Whilst this has been a landmark year for women and there is a lot to celebrate, the latest studies still show that there is a long way to go until women achieve equality on screen and behind the scenes. This conference aims to support, champion and find solutions to creating a more diverse and welcoming entertainment industry for all, regardless of background."


